The Consulate refers to previous correspondence, including its letter of August 23, 1956, concerning the visa application of the former Miss Antoinette Venzac. The Consulate has now been informed that she has recently married Mr. Serge Burzio, an American citizen resident in Puerto Rico.

In view of your expressed interest in her visa application, the Consulate is pleased to inform you that Mrs. Burzio has now been advised it will no longer be necessary for her to await her turn on the quota waiting list, since, as the wife of an American Citizen she is eligible for non-quota status.

In addition to giving Mrs. Burzio instructions on how to avail herself of this advantage, the Consulate has informed her that should it be more convenient for her, her dossier can be transferred to an American Embassy or Consulate which is nearer or easier for her to reach when the time arrives for her personal interview.

You are assured that Mrs. Burzio application will continue to receive every appropriate consideration as promptly as possible.
