Dear Doctor Morales Carrión:

We are delighted with your reply to the invitation to participate in our Eighth Annual Caribbean Conference and in a short time you will receive a formal invitation from our President.

As you will recall, I sent you a "working copy" of the agenda for the conference. In that I used the expression "territories" only in the geographical sense, certainly not the political sense. In the formal program I should like to use some such expression as "British area," "Dutch area," "French area" and "U.S. area." What would be your reactions to this usage? I hope that the title for the conference is sufficiently descriptive to express the scope of the conference.

Do you care to suggest the names of individuals who might deal with section 2, "The Economy," and section 3, "The Society," as colleagues of yours in Round Table 4? Unfortunately Doctor Teodoro Moscoso says that he is unable to discuss "The Economy" and Mrs. Lydia Roberts says that she does not wish to discuss "The Society." I shall therefore welcome any substitutes you may suggest. We plan to invite Governor Muñoz Marín to speak at one of the luncheons or dinners but I am afraid that an invitation at this time might be considered too far in advance for him to make a definite commitment. I should welcome your suggestions in regard to this matter.
