Acheson's speech to Europe:

3 views: War is inevitable, no great strength in free world. War is not inevitable: The object of politics is to prevent war.

No appeasement. West Am. stand behind UN action in Corea.

Any extension will endanger peace of world.

Mac disavowed political ambitions. Do not intend to run for any pol. off. Hope my name will not be used.

Wash: City waiting for welcome. Plane landed on moon - Marshall & Varfan met him. 1000 cheered him. Civic reception will repeat pattern of W. War II. Gen. expected to outline his views. Acheson welcomes debate. Cong. Saddened by death of Vandenberg - [symbolic of day] Truman praised time.

For. Rel. to discuss Pacific Pact. Truman: Plans being made for Pacific defense modeled on Atlantic. US to keep troops in and around Japan. Security Pact

attempted to settle disputes among nations.  
The mechanics have never been successful.  
all have failed. Utter destruction of  
war belies out this alternative. If we  
do not devise other system of life  
Demand improvement of human character.

War is forced upon us, let  
object is victory, not prolonged  
indecision. In war, there is no  
substitute for victory.

Some will appease Red  
China. Blind to history, lesser  
appeasements beget



bloodier war. Like blackmail, it leads  
to greater demands —

To avoid spread conflict with  
China, to "Soviet out"  
Not valid: <sup>China already in row</sup> Sov. will not necessarily  
intervene — will strike when potential  
is in its favor —

Tragedy of Corea: will act to  
its limits while every sanctuary  
fully protected — Corea has risked  
its all again common. Praise  
of Corea people, "courage defies  
description" "Don't scuttle the  
Pacific" —

I have left you fighting sons.  
They are astounded in every way  
by effort: to end savage conflict  
honorably: <sup>opposed me</sup> has caused me  
deepest anguish + anxiety.  
[tumble the way]



I'm doing 52 yrs of service. When  
I joined Army I fulfilled boyhood dreams.  
Hopes + dreams long since vanished.  
Remembered refrain: all soldiers  
never die, they just fade away.
