Information for Passengers

Baggage Insurance. Passengers are advised to insure their baggage, as in the event of loss or damage the Company cannot accept liability beyond the limit specified in passage contract.

Smoking is prohibited in Staterooms, Music Room or Dining Room.

Surgeon. No charge will be made for medical attendance or medicine, except for the treatment of ailments existing prior to embarkation, when the Surgeon, by Company's regulations, is permitted to render a bill subject to the approval of the Captain.

Valuables and Personal Funds may be placed in Purser's safe without charge. Special envelopes are provided to be sealed and signed by the Passenger in presence of Purser. Unless so deposited, the Company cannot assume any liability for loss.

Traveler's Checks. Passengers will find it convenient to provide themselves with any of the well-known traveler's checks. Purser is under no circumstances permitted to accept or cash personal checks.

Transfer to superior accommodations can be arranged only upon payment of the difference in fare to the Purser.

Bulletins. Notices in regard to all matters of interest to passengers will be placed on bulletins located in Main Lobby and Smoking Room.

Letters, Telegrams, Etc. For incoming passengers are placed aboard before steamer is made fast to dock, and passengers should enquire for them before debarking.

Wireless Telegrams should be handed to operator for transmission.

Warning. Passengers are cautioned against playing cards or other games of chance with strangers, thereby avoiding professional gamblers should there be any aboard.
